

During our child initiated learning, EYFS are developing their ability to work together, sharing ideas and using their imagination. After listening to the story, Bruno's Box, we were pleased to find an empty box in the classroom! The children quickly decided they wanted to use it to make their own castle. Initially they drew different features, such as windows, but then began to use scissors to cut these out. They then began to add features such a chimneys by attaching other boxes using tape and glue, working together to achieve this. The children then predicted then tested who would fit inside the castle.


In the garden the children continued to work together, using the crates to build police cars and fire engines as part of our learning about people who help us. To add lights to the vehicles, the children made use of the orange and blue crates they found. They then experimented with different musical instruments to find the best siren sound.























Today was Year 1's Art Day. We welcomed Miss Pettifer, a local artist, in to the school to teach the children how to draw and paint their own self portraits. The children had a lovely couple of hours creating their own self portraits, using the skills they had learnt. We were really proud of the results!



This week, as part of our learning on materials and their properties, Year 2 built model bike sheds using a range of different materials. We predicted which materials would be most suitable, and then in groups we built and tested our sheds to see if they were weather proof. Fortunately, most of our designs were able to withstand the wind due to their strong and rigid properties, however in the time that we had to complete the investigation, none of our sheds were water proof. We were surprised with our results but have thought of some improvements we could make and materials we could combine to make our sheds waterproof and wind proof next time.

This week KS2 enjoyed a fantastic science demonstration in their assembly. They learned about the science behind balloon modelling, plate spinning, rockets and some children even got to have a go themselves! 








Year 3






Year 6




YEAR 6

Music.




