Following our White Rose maths learning the children in Early Years have been identifying shapes with four sides. We have been looking at squares and rectangles. The children were able to spot the differences between these two shapes and noticed that a square had 4 sides that are equal and a rectangle had four sides but, 2 are short and 2 are long. Using our previous knowledge of triangles and circles the children then sorted the shapes in to those that had four sides and those that did not and then were spotting different shapes in the environment.

This week we have been looking at people who help us in school. The children wrote a list including teachers, people who give us first aid, the Headteacher and the site manager. We thought about the different roles all of these people do and what they have to do in school. The children devised excellent questions to find more information out!







This week year one have been completing their own Rapunzel stories. The children have thought carefully about how they have changed the ending on their planning to make a


different ending. We had some fantastic writing this week using adjective to describe nouns in our sentences.

During Maths, we have explored a range of 3D shape and how we can describe them. We have been using the mathematical language or 'vertices' 'edges' and 'faces' to describe them. We thought about how everyday objects we have in the home are 3D shapes! Like the cylinder bean can, or the cuboid cereal box. Try and spot some more at home!

In Geography, we have been looking closely at the google earth image of Staplehurst, as well as identifying what county we are in.


















Year 2 have worked very hard this week on their assessments we are very impressed with their positive attitude they have demonstrated this week. Well done Year 2!

In history, we looked at how London rebuilt after the dangerous fire and about the monument which was built to help people remember.







YEAR 3




In Geography we have been learning about some of the human features along the River Thames in London. They used four figure grid references to locate London Bridge, Canary Wharf and the Thames Barrier. Children learnt about why these are located on the river and the purpose or history of each one.

Our DT lesson this week was focussing on packaging of biscuits. The children looked at a variety of biscuits packing. They discovered what packaging needs and had a go at designing their own.






























YEAR 5

Year 5 became scientists this week, looking at water resistance and how this can change with the shape of the item. To do this we used water in tubes and shapes from plasticine. Timing the speed of the shape dropping to the bottom of the tube helped us to compare the shapes. Ask us which one we thought was quickest and why!

Reading for pleasure is coming to year 5 - we have managed to read our way through several Dog Man books which seem to be a firm favourite! We also created our sketches for 'Me as a Reader' which outlines our ideas of what makes reading great and how we can talk about what we like and why. It means we can share our likes and dislikes with others and begin to get recommendations from each other.

We needed these great lessons as reward for our hard work during assessments








