

EYFS have enjoyed their first full week in school this week. Many of the children are now walking around to their classrooms independently and all are continuing to learn our classroom routines. This week we began our RWI phonics sessions. The children were excited to meet Fred the Frog who helps us when learning our sounds. During child-initiated learning, many children chose to practise writing the new sounds learnt.

Our key text has been The Colour Monster this week. We have been discussing the different emotions we might feel such as happiness, calmness and anger. We discussed that all feelings are okay to feel and what we could do to help ourselves when we feel these different emotions.

In maths this week, following our white rose learning we have been looking at matching and creating sets. We discovered that for objects to match they must be the same and that to copy a set






Year 1 have been answering the question 'What are our school grounds like?' in geography. We have undertaken a fieldwork study around the school to see what human and physical features we could identify. We labelled what we saw and also sorted them into a Venn diagram.

For our science topic, we have been grouping and classifying animals. This week we studied vertebrates and made excellent attempts to draw the skeletons of some animals. Can you guess what they are?

In maths we have been learning to compare numbers and numbers of objects. First we used the terms fewer, more and same to compare. Then we used the mathematical symbols < > and =.

For P.E we have been having lots of fun exploring ways to send and receive a ball.

#### Year 1



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Year 2 have had another great week, packed with learning and fun. In English the children have impressed us with their writing about Paddington. They have used expanded noun phrases to describe his appearance and personality.

In maths we have continued to learn about place value looking at the values of numbers and putting them on a number line.


In DT we looked at parts of a vehicle and discussed how axles and wheels fit onto the chassis of a car, later this term the children will create their own wheeled

In science, we have been observing the growth of our cress and bean seeds and thinking about the conditions they need to grow. We have also learnt about the life cycle of plants and connected this to the seeds growing in our classroom. In geography we have used aerial maps to look at the difference between Staplehurst and London and learnt about some of the landmarks in London. They were excited to spot our school on the map! The children used their knowledge to find the human and physical features in central London.

#### Year 3



Year 3 have are learning about living things and their habitats, focusing on plants. This week children went on an scavenger hunt to look for leaves, buds, flowers and seeds on our school grounds. Children identified the species these belong to. Year 3 were very enthusiastic in finding the different things.

Within geography Year 3 have been identify physical and human features which can be found in Tonbridge and Staplehurst. They have also revised the difference between villages, towns and cities.

As part of our maths unit on place value, children have been using number lines to identify numbers from 0 to 1000. They have had to work out the value of the intervals to position numbers on the numberline.





Year 4



YEAR 3

Year 4 have had a superb week. Children are aware of the behaviour expectations in class and are quick to show they have remembered routines and know exactly what to do.

In English this week we have been learning about features of a newspaper article and how to write as a journalist, using formal conjunctions and journalistic phrases in preparation for writing their own newspaper article soon. They have had opportunities to read news articles from The Week Junior to find key features of journalistic writing.

We are well on the way to recapping time tables we have learnt in previous years. Ensuring we are quick to recall the 2, 5, 3, 10 and 4 times tables.


Everyone was thoroughly enthused for our Science lesson on teeth - as the first part of the digestive system. We used mirrors to look at our own teeth, count how many we had and look at the different shapes and sizes. Once we had learnt the names and function of each of the different teeth types we were given a piece of apple, a grape and a sweet to eat. We had to think about what teeth we are using to eat each one and what our teeth are doing.


The children have been fascinated by our History lesson on buildings from Ancient Civilizations. We learnt what different buildings are made from and what their purpose was. We enjoyed thinking about what type of house we would like to live in and why.



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Year 5





This week has been such a great one - school is really going well.

We completed and edited our first writing which was all about Elysium. Using fronted adverbials and expanded noun phrases to make it more interesting.

In maths, we have continued with place value and started rounding numbers.

We learnt about the Olympian Gods in History and what they represented in the Ancient Greece. How they were celebrated and what they still impact today (the Olympics for one).

In science we looked at the sizes of the planets in comparison to each other, the order in which they are, in our solar system and how far away they all are from each other too!





Year 6



This week Year 6 have been writing a setting description based on our current class text, 'Holes'. In their writing the children have focused on their use of fronted adverbials, figurative language and ambitious vocabulary. They have begun to proof read and edit their work, checking for mistakes and looking for opportunities to better their work.
