Our Harvest Assembly

Our key text this week was 'Winston the Book Wolf' by Marni McGee. In he story, Winston eats words until he is taught to read by his new friend Rosie. We then explored the outside of the school and around our classroom hunting for words for Winston to read, while also getting to know our way around school.

Following our White Rose learning in maths this week we have been comparing amounts using the key words more and fewer, also combining this with our previous weeks learning of sorting objects into sets.

In science we have been identifying different parts of our bodies. This week we focussed on the mouth. We discussed the different functions of the mouth such as eating, talking and breathing. We then explored how we can fill a balloon using our breathe and how a balloon deflated when the air leaves.





Our year 2 children have continued to work hard this week and enjoyed learning across our subjects. In English we have begun our new book, Katie in London, following the adventures of a brother, sister and a magical lion around London landmarks. This ties in with the work we are doing in geography comparing Staplehurst to London. In maths we have been comparing numbers, using place value to work out if numbers or more, less or equal to each other.

Year 2



This week, year 1 discovered a spacecraft had crashed onto the field! The children wrote sentences about what they could see, hear and smell at the crash site. We found out it was the character Beegu from our new text which we have read this week. We are beginning to learn the story so that we can retell it to others before we write our own versions of it.

In maths, we have looked at numberlines and how they can help us count forwards and backwards. We have been matching the numerals on a numberline to an amount of counters on a tens frame, and noticing how the amount changes as we go up in numbers.

During Science this week, the chilldren have looked carefully at the features of a fish. We identified that the gills are how a fish can breathe and that they have scales.



Year 1




We used maps in geography to investigate landmarks in Staplehurst and were able to locate many features on our aerial maps and create a map of Staplehurst as a class. The children had a lot of fun learning to code in computing, using Purple Mash and were able to make a plane move across the screen using commands.

In science we continued to monitor the growth of our beans and learnt about the parts of a plant we can eat.

Year 3




This week Year 3 our pupils have started to design their printing blocks based on the artist Angie Lewin. She is a British printmaker working in linocut, wood engraving, lithography and screen printing. Children have looked at her art work for inspiration before creating their own designs in their sketchbooks.

In music our pupils have been to the music room and were beginning to use the glockenspiels, to follow musical patterns. The children enjoyed working on their musical skills.

In English, children have been writing a setting description, based on this term text 'Leon and the Place Between'. They were writing in the first person to describe he circus scene. Children drafted their sentences on their whiteboards before copying them into their English books.








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


Year 4

Many children were able to remember helping out with a job at home and thought how that made their grownup feel and then how it made them feel.
