Learning Ambassadors - Pupil Voice

 because it's a nice place to read and you can get lots of different types of books.
- My name is Alex, I like Staplehurst school because they are welcoming. They have a massive variety of clubs for example Volleyball, Dodgeball, Choir and Music lessons. My favourite subjects are Maths, English, PE, Music, R.E, I.C.T, Geography, History and Reading. In year 6 you can get roles, mine is a Learning Ambassador.



This week in maths we have been looking at 1,2 and 3. To start the week the children were matching numerals to amounts and used dot plates to help them subitise up to 3.. We then looked at how we can represent these numbers in different ways using counters and cubes. The children were also introduced to a fives frame to help them.

At the end of this week we started to look at one more and one less. We built towers, adding one more each time and discussed what was happening to the tower.

"It is getting taller."

In literacy we have been exploring different types of houses using a variety of key texts. The children discussed what type of home they live in and what the different rooms in the home were used for. The children shared why they think a home is important.

"It keeps us dry if it is raining"

"It is where I play and sleep"





This week in year 1 we have finished writing our own versions of Beegu. We have been so impressed with the imagination and story telling this week!

In Science we have been continuing our learning a bout animals including humans, with this weeks focus on reptiles. The children looked carefully at photographs of different animals and sorted them based on if they had scales, a hard shell or if they were a crocodile. We were amazed to find out that reptiles like turtles can hold their breath for hours under water!

In maths, we have been continuing our work on finding number bonds to numbers within 10, building them on tens frames with counters and exploring how to systematically write down the addition number sentence to match.

During PSHE this week, we have lots of interesting discussion about stereotypes. We spoke about how some activities can often be looked at as being for 'boys' or for 'girls' and how we should support everyone to feel included and not left out.













This week year 2 have had a virtual tour of London, created moving vehicles and used their number bond knowledge to add and subtract. In geography the children looked at a website showing an an aerial view of London and explored landmarks such as The Tower of London and St. Paul's Cathedral. They were excited to spot the famous landmarks and share their own knowledge of London with each other.

In music, the children have clapped along to a rhythm, listened and responded to a song and played chime bars along to a backing track, listening carefully to the pulse of the music.

In English, we have been revising our grammar knowledge using verbs, adjectives and nouns in sentences and showing our understanding of how to use them in our writing. In maths, we added and subtracted 1 to a two digit number then moved onto adding and subtracting 10.

We had a fantastic DT day bringing together the learning the children have completed on transport and what a vehicle needs to move. We learnt key vocabulary and used new skills and techniques to work in a group to create our own moving vehicles!
























This week Year 3 have been continuing their work in science on plants, and what plants need to survive. As part of their learning on the structure of a plant, they were able to look closely at a flower to identify the different parts. Working with a partner, they then labelled each part on their whiteboards.

In art, children were able to enjoy developing their printing skills, using printing ink. They first made their printing blocks, before creating patterns using their designs.

All this has really helped with our understanding of Black History











